BOARD OF DIRECTORS

SERVICE

In 2020, Guthrie County REC:

- Built 17.71 miles of single-phase line across the system.
- Installed 20 new overhead line services to better serve our member-consumers.
- Serviced 58 overcurrent relays and replaced an additional 15.
- Constructed three miles of three-phase line in the territory.
- Placed 36 new underground services.

GROWTH

- Guthrie County REC worked with several utilities to update the Panorama and Yale substations from 34 kV to 69 kV.
- By modernizing and increasing the reliability of an aged electric system, Guthrie County REC is able to add power for consumer-members.

FINANCIAL

In 2020, the Guthrie County REC Board of Directors:

- Allocated \$810,090.46 in patronage from 2019 margins to our member-consumers. •
- Approved a pay out of dividends totaling \$825,000 to members who received electric service in 2004, 2007, 2008, 2009 and 2019.

COMMUNITY

- In order to support power restoration following the August derecho storm, Guthrie County REC sent four linemen to Consumers Energy in Marshalltown.
- Guthrie County REC awarded \$5,000 in college scholarships to five deserving students in AC/ GC, Coon Rapids-Bayard, Elk Horn-Kimballton, Panorama and West Central Valley school districts whose parents are cooperative members.
- The cooperative was proud to donate \$2,500 to the American Legion Post 124 in Guthrie Center with the help of the CoBank Sharing Success Program.
- Guthrie County REC donated STEM kits to schools within the service territory to help students learn more about electricity and renewable energy.

COVID-19 RESPONSE

- Out of concern for our member-consumers and staff, Guthrie County REC closed the office to traffic in March to limit virus exposure.
- Linemen were seperated into smaller crews to reduce the potential for exposure. Following CDC guidelines, Guthrie County REC initiated a mask madate within the office to limit
- the need to guarantine.
- Guthrie County REC embraced Microsoft Teams and Zoom meetings to maintain productivity while social distancing.
- Guthrie County REC applied for the Payroll Protection Program to protect staff and operational efficiency.
